

ROYAL MILITARY COLLEGE (RMC) ENTRANTS. To enter as a General Service Officer (GSO) Graduating from RMC, not only will you have completed the best leadership Direct entrants complete an 18 month GSO course, covering leadership, - direct entrant, you must be at least 17 years of age and have passes in Year 12 and management training in Australia, you will be awarded an Associate management and military skills. English and three other subjects. You can also be a tertiary student or a graduate Diploma in Personnel Administration. ADFA graduates also receive their Entering through ADFA, you first must complete a degree in Engineering, **Army Officer** from a tertiary institution. degree in their chosen field from the University of NSW.
